
# BORDEAUX RIVER CRUISE

Along these waterways are vineyards that yield the celebrated wines of Bordeaux. Enjoy tastings of Médoc, St.-Émilion, Côtes de Bourg, and other appellations as you visit walled towns, castles and wineries. The grand finale of your cruise is Bordeaux itself, an elegant city that will reveal a heritage both French and English. Professor Emeritus John Hyde will accompany your cruise with talks and commentary on the region's past and present.

Your 146-guest river cruise ship *AmaDolce* is just right for the journey! Large enough to provide ample lounges, a deck with a walking track, and a fleet of over twenty bicycles, it is still intimate and welcoming. Most cabins have full-length windows with French balconies, for maximum light and viewing. Surrounded by the panorama of Aquitaine's castles and landscapes, you'll enjoy inventive regional meals, wine with lunch and dinner, and the services of an outstanding staff.

You may end your trip in Bordeaux or extend it with a three-day visit to the towns, châteaux and wineries of the beautiful Loire Valley and fly home from Paris.

Consider a September cruise on the bucolic Dordogne and Garonne among the vineyards of Bordeaux. You'll take daily excursions to medieval cities, villages, and castles, while sampling the renowned wines of the region on visits to cellars and tasting rooms.

History abounds at every port along this scenic river cruise. Tour fortification ruins built by Charlemagne in the 10th century. Visit the walled village of Bourg-sur-Gironde constructed by the

Romans, destroyed by the Normans, and later fortified by the English. Meander the UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Blaye Citadel, the Underground Churches of St.- Émilion, and the magnificent city of Bordeaux. Accompanying the group and enhancing your understanding of the region's complex history will be John Hyde, Brown Professor of History, Emeritus. Professor Hyde has been a wise discussion leader and companion for over a dozen Williams College alumni trips.

The river cruise ship AmaDolce carries just 146 guests in style and comfort. The ship is known for good food and service, for including wines with lunch and dinner, and for allowing guests as much panoramic scenery as possible. Some 80% of the cabins are fitted with full-length windows and French balconies, and the rest have two good-sized fixed windows. The ship and the program are designed to accommodate your preferences with such features as biking excursions, early-riser breakfast, and the "Gentle Walkers" group.

This cruise offers immersion in a storied wine region, steeped in history. When you disembark in Bordeaux, you can return home or join a three-day tour through the gentle Loire Valley, stopping at historic towns, chateaux and perhaps another winery. # CRUISE TO CADILLAC • VISIT TO SAUTERNES REGION WITH TASTING • VISIT TO ROQUETAILLADE CASTLE

Cruise from Bordeaux up the Garonne to Cadillac, an area renowned for its outstanding white wines. Disembark and head to the Sauternes wine region across the river from Cadillac, where you'll have the opportunity to taste prized dessert wines. Afterwards we'll visit the Château Roquetaillade. The first fortifications here were built by Charlemagne in the 10th century as his army advanced toward the Pyrenées. These are in ruins, but a later castle built on the site was restored by the 19th-century historical architect Viollet-le-Duc. The château has been maintained under the same family since 1306.

This evening *AmaDolce* cruises down the river toward Pauillac, on the left bank of the Gironde Estuary. *B/L/D* 

Saturday, September 9

# TOUR OF PAUILLAC • MÉDOC WINE TASTING • OVERNIGHT IN PAUILLAC

Enjoy the lovely village of Pauillac, in the famed Haut-Médoc AOC. (An AOC, appellation d'origine contrôlée, is a governmentauthorized designation of origin that signifies where grapes are grown). Pauillac's gravelly soils are renowned for producing some of the world's finest Bordeaux wines, especially those made from the Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot grape varietals. You'll be able to sample local vintages this afternoon at a

Grand Cru Classé wine tasting. After some time to explore Pauillac, return to the ship for dinner and spend the evening as you please. *AmaDolce* will remain in Pauillac overnight. *B/L/D* 

Sunday, September 10

# CRUISE TO BLAYE • VISIT BLAYE CITADEL OR BIKETOUR • AFTERNOON IN MEDIEVAL BOURG

This morning the ship crosses the Gironde Estuary from Pauillac to Blaye, a small town north of Bordeaux known both for its red wines and its military history. Choose from two excursions this morning. The first takes you to Blaye Citadel, built during the reign of Louis XIV by the famed military engineer Major Vaubon. Within the fortress are buildings

and ruins including a Medieval castle and gate, and the 15th-century watchtower. We will tour the citadel, now a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and view the expansive estuary from above.

The other option for the morning is a bicycle tour. Wind your way through the vineyards, see some of the impressive châteaux and cross one of the



pilgrimage routes to Santiago de Compostela. (Four routes run through France and converge in northern Spain; this is the westernmost.)

Return to the ship for lunch and prepare for an afternoon in Bourg-sur-Gironde, an historic walled village at the confluence of the Dordogne and Garonne. You may reach Bourg either by coach or by a bike route that takes you along the scenic coastal path called the "Captain's Road." Bourg, built on a rocky outcrop during Roman times, destroyed by the Normans and later fortified by the English, now invites strolling along the picturesque streets that lead to the harbor. Pass through the Porte de Mer and the King's Stairway, an enduring result of a visit by Louis XIV. You'll also see the home of the legendary French corsair Jean Bart. Afterwards enjoy a festival of music and wine from the appellation of Côtes du Bourg. AmaDolce will remain in Bourg overnight. B/L/D

# CRUISE THE DORDOGNE TO LIBOURNE • ST. ÉMILION WINE TASTING & TOUR OF POMEROL OR GUIDED BIKE TOUR & WINE TASTING

Cruise up the Dordogne past hilltop châteaux and riverine villages to Libourne, a center of wine production near the renowned regions of St. Émilion and Pomerol. You can either enjoy a Grand Cru Classé wine tasting and a visit to the Underground Churches in St.-Émilion, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and a panoramic tour of the châteaux and vineyards of Pomerol, or join a guided bike tour through the vineyards of both towns followed by a wine tasting. Return to Libourne, where your ship will moor overnight. *B/L/D* 

## CHÂTEAU VAYRES OR VISIT TO FORTIFIED BASTIDE • WINE TASTING IN FRONSAC OR CHÂTEAU DE MONTAIGNE • CRUISE TO BORDEAUX • CAPTAIN'S FAREWELL DINNER

You have two options for the morning's adventures, and two for the afternoon. Tour the Château Vayres on the banks of the Dordogne and learn of its long and tumultuous history, or visit a well-preserved bastide, one of the area's fortified medieval towns, and enjoy its traditional market. This afternoon take part in a wine tasting in Fronsac or tour the Château de Montaigne, a magnificent 14th-century castle that was acquired by the great-grandfather of the philosopher Michel de Montaigne and remained their family residence for generations. It stands within a splendid park designed by Montaigne himself.

This evening *AmaDolce* sails to Bordeaux, where we will dock and celebrate with the Captain's Farewell Dinner. The ship remains in Bordeaux overnight. *B/L/D* 

Wednesday, September 13

# BORDEAUX: WALKING TOUR WITH TASTING AT WINE MUSEUM OR GUIDED BIKE TOUR • TIME ON YOUR OWN IN BORDEAUX

Today you'll visit the elegant port city of Bordeaux on your choice of a walking tour or a guided bike tour. This wine capital is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and also aptly classed as a "City of Art and History." You'll see many of the city's monuments (though not all 360 within its borders!) and take part in a tasting at the Wine Museum. Among the outstanding areas is the historic district called the Golden Triangle, with harmonious 18th-century architecture, the magnificent Grand Théâtre and the monumental Quinconces Square, one of the largest in Europe.



Among the many other sites on your route is the Pont de Pierre, built under Napoléon, which for 150 years was Bordeaux's only bridge over the Garonne.

In the afternoon you may choose according to your interests from the many attractions in Bordeaux. These include the gardens, shops and cafés of Chartrons, the lively renewed riverfront district, the more medieval part of the city preserved around Rue Ste.-Catherine, and numerous fine museums. The *AmaDolce* will remain docked in Bordeaux for the night. *B/L/D*

# DISEMBARK AMADOLCE • VISIT CITY OF TOURS, WITH WALKING TOUR • ARRIVE IN AMBOISE • DINNER ON YOUR OWN

Disembark your ship in Bordeaux and continue your journey to Tours by TGV high-speed train. Experience this charming city in the Loire Valley, with medieval streets brimming with art, history, lovely gardens and tasty cuisine. Stop at a lively restaurant or market for lunch on your own before you take a walking tour. Later transfer to your hotel in nearby Amboise, check in and have dinner on your own. **B** 

Friday, September 15

## CHÂTEAU D'AMBOISE • CHÂTEAU DU CLOS LUCÉ • TOUR OF CHENONCEAU

Tour the spectacular Château d'Amboise, which stands on a promontory by the river. Once a walled fortress, it was seized from the Amboise family by Charles VII in 1434 and became a favorite rural residence of the Valois kings. It was transformed into a Gothic palace by Charles VIII and updated later with Italianate features. We will tour the residences and gardens, and visit the Gothic chapel, the burial place of Leonardo da Vinci. Later you'll have a chance to discover the Château du Close Lucé, Leonardo

da Vinci's last home, where he completed works including Mona Lisa and the Virgin and Child with Saint Anne. Streams, small waterfalls and the artist/inventor's two-level bridge are interspersed with many plant species, and the château holds drawings and constructions of some of his inventions.

Take time for lunch on your own before an afternoon tour of the stunning Château de Chenonceau. When Henri II inherited this estate in 1547, he gave it to his mistress, Diane de Poitiers, who oversaw the planting of the beautiful gardens and the building of a now-iconic bridge over the River Cher. After



Henri II's death she lost the château to his widow, Catherine de' Medici, who also loved the site, expanded the gardens, and added the ballroom over her rival's graceful bridge. We will tour the interior and stroll by the gardens and riverbank before your return to the hotel in Tours. **B** 

Saturday, September 16

## CHÂTEAU DE CHAMBORD • CHÂTEAU DE BLOIS • TRANSFER TO HOTEL NEAR CHARLES DE GAULLE AIRPORT

Leave Tours this morning for the great royal château at Chambord, which François I had built as his hunting lodge. At its center is a double-helix staircase, surrounded by suites and great halls. A complex terrace wraps the structure, providing views of the castle itself and of the extensive forested park. On your tour of the château note the motif of the salamander, the emblem of François I, carved into stonework.

We will stop at one other château, which over several centuries was the residence of seven kings and ten queens. It's the Château de Blois, whose various wings reflect flamboyant Gothic, Italian Renaissance and classical styles. Blois, like Chambord, features a double-helix staircase, this one the site of a royal murder in 1576 now memorialized in paintings and re-enactments.

You will have time for lunch on your own in Blois before transferring by bus to your hotel near Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport. **B**

# **Ship Details**

#### Staterooms and Suites

The river cruise ship *AmaDolce* (2009) offers attractive, well-appointed staterooms. All but three measure 170 sq ft; two are single cabins of 140 sq ft, and one (Category A+) is similar to the three suites but with 225 sq ft rather than 255. All cabins and suites on the Violin and Cello Decks have full-length windows and French balconies; cabins on the Piano Deck have two fixed windows. Suites have a sitting area with a couch, and a large bathroom with separate shower and tub.

All cabins allow for separate or combined bed configurations and are provided with individually-controlled air-conditioning, ample closet space, under-bed space for suitcases, white-on-white down bedding, terry robes and slippers, a marble-appointed bath with hair dryer, daily bottled water, a safe, high-speed Internet and flat-panel TV with local and satellite channels. The video library for cabin viewing includes travelogues as well as first-run and classic films.

## **Public spaces**

AmaDolce, with dark wood and neutrals brightened with terra cotta, provides a warm, gracious environment. An elevator connects the Violin Deck with the Cello Deck, site of the well-appointed restaurant. The ship provides a walking track and whirlpool on the Sun Deck, and a fitness center and massage/beauty/hair salon below. Smoking is permitted only on the Sun Deck. AmaDolce carries a fleet of over two dozen bicycles, and helmets, available while in port for guests to ride the riverside bike paths.



#### Food

The breakfast buffet includes a range of hot and cold items, including made-to-order specialties; lunch buffets feature fresh salads, pasta dishes, other hot entrées and an array of desserts. Multi-course dinners of fine regional cuisine are prepared under the direction of award-winning chefs, making use of the region's fresh produce. (This is the one cruise line awarded membership in the Chaîne des Rôtisseurs.) Free-flowing regional wines, beer or soft drinks are included with lunch and dinner.


Seating is open, and dress for dinner is country club casual, but more festive at the Welcome Dinner and Captain's Dinner. The ship also offers an early-riser breakfast and a light lunch option in the Main Lounge, where tea or complimentary espresso drinks are available in the afternoon as well as sandwiches, pastries and cookies.


# **Deck Plan**


