

Join Professor Markes Johnson and Research Scientist Gudveig Baarli on optional excursions that explore these environs, and enjoy life aboard Star Breeze, a sleek white 212-guest ship with opportunities for learning, renewal and conviviality. The grand finale of your cruise is a traversal of the Panama Canal. You may have imagined the rise and descent through the locks of this great waterway since childhood. This is your chance to experience the "path" that through all obstacles joined the Pacific to the Caribbean. Before the cruise you may take in more of Costa Rica's magnificent biodiversity on a pre-cruise extension in the Monteverde Cloud Forest.

Saturday, January 21

DEPART U.S. • ARRIVE SAN JOSÉ, COSTA RICA • TRANSFER TO PUERTO CALDERA & BOARD STAR BREEZE • PREPARATIONS AND INTRODUCTIONS • WELCOME DINNER

Arrive at Juan Santamaria International Airport, where you will be met and accompanied on the drive to Puerto Caldera on the Gulf of Nicoya. Board *Star Breeze*, settle into your suite and take part in the safety drill before the "Sail Away" at 6:00 p.m. After an introduction to the ship and the itinerary, enjoy your first dinner aboard as you cruise down the coast toward Quepos.

From some U.S. airports you can fly to San José in time to reach Puerto Caldera by late afternoon. In that case you may leave for Costa Rica on embarkation day. We highly recommend that you fly to Costa Rica on Friday, January 20, and take the pre-cruise overnight package. The cost of \$125 per person includes an overnight stay at the Marriott San José, the airport-hotel transfer, breakfast, taxes, and the transfer by coach to the ship on Saturday.

Sunday, January 22

ARRIVE QUEPOS • OPTIONAL GROUP EXCURSION TO MANUEL ANTONIO NATIONAL PARK • EVENING DEPARTURE TOWARD BAHÍA DRAKE

Arrive this morning at Quepos, the gateway to Manuel Antonio National Park. This renowned park protects an extensive rainforest laced with paths for great viewing, a wealth of animal and bird life, and

several white-sand beaches. The featured optional shore excursion with Prof. Johnson is a nature walk through Manuel Antonio followed by swimming or beach time. Other optional excursions include a boat trip through the mangrove ecosystem, a drive to a village in the nearby Fila Chonta Mountains, a floating/paddling trip on one of the region's rivers, and a zip-line rainforest canopy tour. At 6:00 p.m. Star Breeze will sail from Quepos along the coast toward Bahía Drake (Drake Bay). B/L/D

Monday, January 23

ARRIVE BAHÍA DRAKE • OPTIONAL GROUP EXCURSION TO TERRABA-SIERPE WETLANDS & MANGROVES • CRUISE TO GOLFO DULCE

Disembark at Bahía Drake, where Sir Francis Drake is said to have come ashore in the late 16th century. The beautiful coastline of sparkling coves, pristine beaches and rocky crags forms part of Corcovado National Park, a nature preserve that occupies nearly a third of the Osa Peninsula. The park conserves one of the few sizeable lowland tropical rainforests remaining in the world. The group optional excursion today takes you by boat to the Terraba-Sierpe National Wetlands, the largest mangrove reserve in Latin America. You will have several hours to explore

the river branches, watching for wildlife including Howler and Capuchin Monkeys, herons and other water birds, crocodiles, caimans and turtles. There will be a stop for a typical lunch in one of the restaurants along the river in Sierpe.

Among other optional excursions are a zip-line canopy tour, horseback riding with a naturalist guide, snorkeling, and a hiking tour that takes in forest, seashore, freshwater ponds and gardens. If you choose to swim today (seas permitting), you might find yourself in the company of marlins

and dolphins. After your day's adventure return to *Star Breeze*, which will set off around the peninsula for the Golfo Dulce. *B/L/D*

Tuesday, January 24

GOLFO DULCE (PUERTO JIMÉNEZ) • OPTIONAL GROUP EXCURSION TO BOTANICAL GARDEN • GOLFITO

Spend the day in Golfo Dulce, an area where both the jungle and the sea brim with diverse lifeforms. Foliage grows down the steep hillsides to the waterline, and the hoots of monkeys echo through the vine-laced trees. Join Prof. Johnson for a boat trip to view the rainforest that borders the gulf. You will visit Casa Orquideas, a garden with a great array of plants from the tropics and other regions of the world, and if weather permits, there will be opportunity to swim or enjoy the beach. Alternative optional

excursions include a visit to a traditional cacao plantation, a dolphin watch in part of the bay that *National Geographic* deems "the most biologically intense area on earth," and a kayak trip. In the late afternoon your ship will head across Golfo Dulce to call briefly at Golfito, known for its calm waters and lovely beaches. Then cruise the coast past the southernmost tip of Costa Rica to the blue Pacific and Panama's Isla de Coíba. *B/L/D*

Wednesday, January 25

ISLA DE COÍBA, PANAMA • BEACH ACTIVITIES AND BARBECUE

Isla de Coíba is designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The warm, clear waters teem with marine life surrounded by one of the largest coral reefs in the Pacific, and the island is home to ancient forests, rare plant and animal species and large numbers of scarlet macaw. On a lovely secluded beach, enjoy a day of activities such as a stretching class, yoga, volleyball or bocce, and of course swimming, snorkeling and other water sports. The ship's naturalist will host nature hikes on the island (small fee). At midday the chef and culinary staff present a feast of grilled meats and shellfish with side dishes, salads, tropical fruits and freshly baked desserts. Stay and enjoy the beach and the island until your Sail Away at 6:00 p.m. *Note: The location of the beach barbecue depends on weather and sea conditions.* **B/L/D**

Thursday, January 26

DAY AT SEA, WITH LECTURES AND ACTIVITIES ON BOARD • OPEN DECK BARBECUE DINNER

This is your day at sea as *Star Breeze* rounds the Azuero Peninsula toward the Gulf of Panama. There will be a talk by Markes Johnson on the region's geological history and a session on the building of the Panama Canal. You'll have time to pursue other activities aboard, from spa treatments to reading to relaxing with friends.

End the day with a Windstar tradition, the barbecue on the pool deck (weather permitting). Featured are such dishes as grilled lobster, jerk chicken and seafood paella, as well as salads, grilled vegetables, fruits and desserts. The ship's two musical duos take turns performing, and later the deck is cleared for line dancing. Overnight your ship will continue toward the coast of Panama. *B/L/D*

Friday, January 27

TRANSIT OF PANAMA CANAL

In the early morning, when lights still illuminate the inner workings of the waterway, pass Fort



Amador and enter the Panama Canal for the 51-mile voyage across the Isthmus and through the Continental Divide to the Caribbean. More than 80,000 workers took part in this massive construction project, carving through earth and granite and building three sets of enormous locks. Vessels ranging from vast container ships to small passenger craft such as *Star Breeze* are raised and then lowered some 85 feet over the course of 8–10 hours.

You will pass through the two flights of the Miraflores Locks and the single stage of the Pedro Miguel Locks, with the rainforest of Soberania National Park on the ship's starboard side. Continue through the Galliard (Culebra) Cut, the deepest portion of the canal that cuts through the Continental Divide, and emerge on Lake Gatun, which is the source of the millions of gallons of fresh water that fill the locks. Continuing toward Limon Bay and the Caribbean, your ship will pass through the three-stage Gatun Locks and will arrive in Colón toward evening. This city is shaped by the Zona Libre, the largest free-trade zone in the Americas; it also offers colonial architecture and fine beaches. Celebrate your journey at the farewell dinner with friends old and new. B/L/D

COLÓN: DISEMBARK STAR BREEZE • TRANSFER TO PANAMA CITY AIRPORT • RETURN TO U.S.


Depart for San José, Costa Rica, where you will land at Juan Santamaria International Airport. Transfer by airport shuttle to your nearby hotel. If you arrive by early afternoon, you could take a taxi into San José to visit the Pre-Columbian Gold Museum, the ornate National Theater, or other sites of interest. Have dinner on your own and return to your hotel for the night.

Thursday, January 1

MORNING DRIVE TO MONTEVERDE • SUGAR MILL TOUR & MEETING WITH LOCAL FAMILY • BANANA AND COFFEE PLANTATIONS • TIME TO EXPLORE ON YOUR OWN

You will be met at the airport or your hotel and driven to the Monteverde Cloud Forest, which was founded by a group of Quakers seeking a place to live harmoniously with nature. The Cloud Forest Reserve is one of the outstanding wildlife sanctuaries in the tropics. Its six ecological zones are habitat for some 2,000 native plant species, over 100 mammals including jaguar and ocelot, and more than 300 birds including the Resplendent Quetzal.

Tour a sugar mill (*trapiche*) to meet a local family and learn about the production of sugar from cane. You will also see banana plantations and aspects of coffee farming and production. Stop for lunch at a local restaurant before returning to your hotel, where you have the rest of the day on your own to explore the area. *B/L*



Friday, January 20

HIKE ON CLOUD FOREST RESERVE TRAILS • TIME ON YOUR OWN FOR OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES

After breakfast, meet your guide in the lobby for a hike through the well-kept trails of the Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve. You will find cooling waterfalls, a great variety of colorful flora and fauna and, with luck, a Quetzal, one of the most beautiful of all birds. After lunch together in a local restaurant you have the afternoon free for your choice of optional activities, which range from a visit to the Butterfly Garden to a zip-line canopy tour. *B/L*

Saturday, January 21

TRANSFER TO PUERTO CALDERA • BOARD STAR BREEZE • PREPARATIONS AND INTRODUCTIONS • WELCOME DINNER

Leave the hotel after breakfast for the drive through the mountains to the coast, where your ship *Star Breeze* will be waiting at Puerto Caldera. **B**




Star Breeze Ship Description

Windstar Cruises acquired and thoroughly updated *Star Breeze* in 2015, creating an all-suite ship small enough to enter small harbors and coves yet large enough to provide spacious suites and an array of facilities and services.

All 106 suites have a sitting room at the outside, allowing views of sea, coast and sky. Unless otherwise noted they have queen beds that can be reconfigured as twins. The 64 Ocean View Suites with picture windows and 36 Balcony Suites with full-length windows and French-style balconies each measure 277 sq ft. The Owner's Suites, at 575 sq ft, and the four Classic Suites, two at 400 sq ft and two at 530 sq ft, have private verandas.

Suites are equipped with Egyptian cotton bedding, robes and slippers, a walk-in closet and ample drawer space, flat-screen TV with DVD and CD players, and Bose SoundDock® system, a mini-bar/refrigerator, a safe, and 110/220 outlets. The bath features a granite countertop, a tub/shower combination, and L'Occitane® bath products. Internet cards may be purchased at Reception for use in your suite or the Computer Room.

Elevators connect all the passenger decks, and modified wheelchair-accessible suites are available. These are Suites 134, 136, 232 and 234, which have fixed queen beds, a shower with a small lip, and a bathroom step with a portable ramp. Doorways are standard. [See note on Physical Requirements for this cruise.] A doctor and limited medical facilities are available on board.



Public spaces include a large lounge with panoramic windows, the Star Bar outdoors on deck, the piano lounge Compass Rose, and the Show Lounge with evening entertainment. There's a theater with a very large flat-screen television for watching news or films. On the Sun Deck is a small counter-current pool and a whirlpool; you'll also find a hot tub on Deck 5. The ship has a library with books and DVDs, a shop, a small casino, a fitness center that offers yoga and other activities, and a spa. Smoking is permitted only in an area adjacent to the Star Bar or on an outer deck aft of the lounge.

The Water Sports Platform on Deck 3 is opened when the ship is at anchor and the seas are calm enough for kayaking, swimming, paddle boarding or pedal boating. Motorized Zodiac inflatable craft will transport groups as needed, and at some ports a tender motors at intervals to shore and back.

The main restaurant aboard is AmphorA, where dinner is served nightly. Travelers on *Star Breeze* have been pleased with the variety of meat entrées, the fresh fish, and the attention to vegetarian options. Seating is open; dress is elegantly casual here and for evenings in the lounge (no shorts, t-shirts, tank tops, jeans, flip-flops or tennis shoes). Casual buffet as well as full-service dining is available at breakfast and lunch at Veranda, with indoor and terrace seating. A third venue, the intimate Candles, offers a chance to dine under the stars one evening during your cruise if weather permits.

In addition, continental breakfast is available by the Yacht Club coffee bar from 6:00 a.m. until noon, coffee beverages such as cappuccino are offered through the day, and appetizers are served most evenings before dinner. Room service is always available.
